Within the framework of the Fair "104 - The caregiving expo. We take care of those who take care", scheduled at the Pordenone Fair from May 8 to 10, Pavilion 6 of the Fair will be entirely dedicated to inclusive sports. Over 20 sports disciplines, more than 200 athletes and technicians, conferences, presentations, round tables, demonstrations, and tournaments will allow visitors to personally experience this extraordinary world.

The inauguration

On Thursday, May 8 at 1:45 PM, the pavilion dedicated to sports will be officially inaugurated. The President of Panathlon International Giorgio Chinellato, along with representatives of the municipal administration and the Pordenone Fair, will deliver the opening remarks. The event's patron, Giada Rossi, Paralympic gold medalist in table tennis in Paris, and international delegations from Austria, Slovenia, and Croatia will be present.

The conferences

Thursday, May 8, 2:00 PM: Disability without borders

Moderated by RAI journalist Filippo Grassia, representatives from Italy, Croatia, Slovenia, and Austria will be present: Damir Bucic, Olympic water polo player and secretary of Istria Sportsmen; spokesperson for Italian Paralympic athletes Matteo Parenzan and a CIP representative; Michael Aussewinkler, President of Panathlon Club Klagenfurt, former governor of Carinthia and Minister of Health of the Austrian Republic; Damjan Lazar, President of the Slovenian Paralympic Committee.

Following this, the event's patron, Giada Rossi, Paralympic gold medalist in table tennis in Paris, will give a demonstration of this sport with her teammates Matteo Parenzan, Paralympic gold medalist in Paris, and Carlotta Ragazzini, Paralympic bronze medalist in Paris,

along with the national team's technicians, providing a spectacular demonstration of this remarkable sport.

Friday, May 9, 9:30 AM: Smaller and more fragile. Prevention in the first 1000 days of life

Moderated by Dr. Serena Bontempi, President of Scricciolo - Association of parents of preterm or at-risk newborns. Speakers include: Dr. Laura Travan - Director of the Complex Structure of Neonatology and Neonatal Intensive Care - Burlo Garofalo Trieste; Dr. Maria Manfrida - Head of the Simple Structure of Neonatology at Pordenone Hospital.

Friday, May 9, 3:00 PM: Beyond care - rights and support for the well-being of the person

The workshop will have a specific focus on Law 104 and Eating Disorders. Tools, protections, and benefits of the care pathway through sports will be illustrated. Orietta dal Dan and Federica Fogolin from ADAO will intervene.

Sports to watch and try

Structures, technicians, and athletes will be present to illustrate and, in some cases, allow visitors to try the following disciplines: athletics, baskin, bocce, powerchair hockey, pararowing, cycling with handybike, footbike, table football, judo, weightlifting, indoor sport fishing, showdown, tennis and goalball for the blind and visually impaired, chess, sitting volleyball, sports dance, archery, shooting.

International tournaments and demonstrations

During the fair days, international baskin and sitting volleyball tournaments and powerchair hockey demonstration matches will take place.
